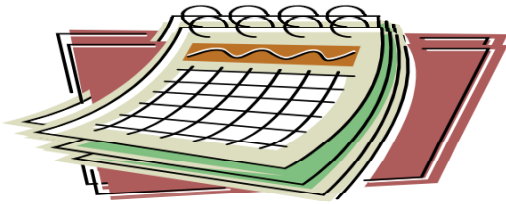
- Complete the Screening Process (including submitting to a background check);
- Acknowledge receipt of the Archdiocesan Policy Relating to Sexual Misconduct, and the appropriate Code of Conduct; and
- Complete the Safe Environment Training appropriate to their position.
