FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Enough with the serious business, I thought I would sweeten things up in preparation for Thanksgiving by sharing a great recipe for carrot cake with cream cheese frosting and topped with browned coconut flakes. This recipe was given to me when I was working as a cook in a nursing home. So here it goes!

Preheat the oven at 350°F. Cake ingredients are as follows: 2 cups of all-purpose flour, ½ teaspoon of baking soda, 1 teaspoon of baking powder, 1 teaspoon of salt, 2 teaspoons of ground cinnamon, 1¾ cups of white sugar, 1 cup of vegetable oil, 3 eggs, 1 teaspoon of vanilla extract, 2 cups of grated carrots, 1 cup of flaked coconut, 1 cup of raisins and 1 (8 ounce can) of crushed pineapple, drained. Mix the dry ingredients together, then add in eggs and oil, followed by remaining ingredients. After all of the ingredients have been added, mix for one minute. Pour batter evenly into three greased and floured 9" round cake pans. Bake at 350°F for approximately 45 minutes or until toothpick comes out clean.

After the cake is removed from the oven it is time to brown the coconut flakes. Spread 2 cups of coconut flakes on a cookie sheet. Place them in the oven 350°F, stir them every three minutes until they reach the desired golden brown color. Put them aside to cool.

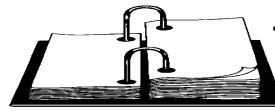
Frosting ingredients are as follows 1 (8 ounce) package of cream cheese, ¼ pound (1 stick) of butter, 1 teaspoon of vanilla extract, 2 boxes of confectioners' sugar. Allow butter and cream for the frosting to warm up to room temperature for approximately 30 minutes by letting them sit on the counter. After mixing the cream cheese and butter together, gradually add in the confectioners' sugar and vanilla extract to the mixture. Whip at high speed till the frosting is light and airy. Place first layer on desired cake plate, stack the three layers spreading frosting between the layers. After frosting the cake in its entirety, take the browned coconut flakes and pat them on to the sides of the cake. Sprinkle the remaining flakes on to the top of the cake. Cake is best when it has been refrigerated before serving.

COLD & FLU SEASON

Many people have asked about the practice of receiving the Precious Blood from a communal cup now that cold and flu season is upon us. We would like to remind everyone that the Church's teachings encourage everyone to receive from the cup. It also recommends that, if someone is not well, or has been exposed to someone who is not well, that they should refrain from receiving from the cup. Therefore, we ask that if you or someone in your immediate vicinity is ill, please forego the cup and resume when you are feeling better.

Another concern that has been brought up is shaking hands at the Sign of Peace. Again, if you are not well, a simple nod of acknowledgment is perfectly acceptable. We wish to keep everyone as healthy as possible.
