FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

After discussion with the staff, I have decided to make some changes in the way we celebrate Morning Prayer. Beginning Monday, November 3rd we will celebrate Morning Prayer at 8:00am in the Friars' Chapel

The reason for the time change to 8:00 is to give Morning Prayer adequate time to be celebrated well and with greater solemnity on special days in the church year. This new time will bring together the ringing of the church bells and the praying of the Angelus.

The motivation behind the change of venue from the nave of the church to the Friars' Chapel is to facilitate Morning Prayer more effectively. We will pray in the intimate setting of the Friar's Chapel where we will be able to sit in choir form, hear one another, and not be affected by people entering for Mass.

To enhance our Morning Prayer, and to bring us in alignment with the intended outline of the service prescribed by the Church, we will add a song of gathering. To highlight special days in the liturgical calendar, we will sing the Canticle of Zechariah on feasts and solemnities.

It is my belief that these changes will assist us in having a more contemplative prayer experience and thus deepen our spiritual life.

CATHOLIC LAWYERS' GUILD RED MASS
