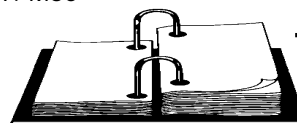

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

After a month of reviewing the office activity in the evenings and weekends, I have decided to reduce the office hours. Effective December 1, the office will close at 5:00pm Monday through Friday and at 1pm on Saturday and Sunday afternoons. The new phone system installed recently in the friary has minimized the need for an operator. Each friar has a direct-dial number with the capability of receiving voice messages. In addition, the Mass schedule will be available soon through the main telephone menu. We will also stabilize the Mass schedule at the Tower and the Manor. As of January on the first and third Saturdays the 4:00pm Mass will take place at the Fr. Finian Sullivan Tower and on the second and fourth it will take place at the Monastery Manor. On a fifth Saturday the 4:00pm Mass will be held at the Tower and the Christmas and Easter Masses, with the larger attendance, will take place in the bigger room which is at the Manor.

The reduction of hours is timely in that one of our "nights and weekend" workers has given in her resignation. The reduction in hours will not affect the remaining three workers. They will maintain the same number of hours that they are presently working. The activity during these night and weekend hours was minimal. It did not justify the expense of paying an employee to work these hours. I apologize for the inconveniences that may occur as a result of the change. If you have any concerns in regards to these changes please feel free to speak to me about them.
