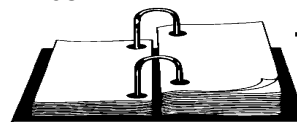

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK....

This weekend at each of the Masses the blessing of lay liturgical ministers will take place. As a parish we are dependent upon close to two hundred people who serve in the various capacities of ministry as members of the Bereavement Group, Eucharistic Ministers, Readers, Altar Servers, Ushers, and part of the Music Ministry. Good liturgy is dependent upon the participation of the assembly and lay faithful who take leadership roles. These roles are essential.

For a funeral liturgy to have grace and dignity we need individuals who are willing to serve in various ministries. For us to minister communion in a timely manner and in both species, Christ's Body and His Blood, we need the non-ordained to be involved. So that the Gospel is understood to be the climax of the Liturgy of the Word, distinct from the other readings, and that there be more than one voice in the liturgy we need the laity to take on the role of Reader. For the setting of the altar and holding the book so that the priest can use both hands at the time of blessing we need Altar Servers. To give people a word of welcome when entering the church, to show people to their seats, to assist in cases of emergencies, and to collect your financial support we need the Ushers. To enhance our liturgies' singing we need individuals who are gifted in the field of music to assist us. Each minister is important and essential. On behalf of the parish I would like to thank those who serve in these various ministries. We are grateful to each and every one of you for your service to the church. May God reward you for your dedication and service.
